Before you arrive to the track

Ensure you complete the required sign on / indemnity form and scrutiny forms online using the <u>INEO</u> system.

Check that your race number is correct on the entry system and on all 4 sides of your kart.

 ullet Ensure that you have entered the correct transponder number on your entry & that your transponder is charged.

All Novice drivers MUST run Black plates with White numbers.

Designated Fuel Station for Round 1 is TOP Oil (Carrolls, Formerly Emo Oil), Knocktopher Service Station, Kilkenny, R95 Y6FX. The pumps to be used are pumps 7 and 8.

Fuel from this station and these pumps is the only permitted fuel to be used for the event from Timed Qualifying until the completion of all Finals by all competitors.

When you arrive at the track

🏴 You must adhere to the parking plan that has been provided & follow the instructions of personnel on site.

🏴 Please ensure you use the bins provided, however please take home used tyres, etc.

Please ensure that you leave the facility in the same condition that it was in when you arrived.


Electric Scooters and Bikes are not permitted in the paddock at any time.

Scrutiny

There is no longer a requirement to present your kart and equipment for scrutiny and scanning on Saturday evening. However, it is the responsibility of each driver to complete their scrutiny form online using the INEO system before presenting themselves to Driver Check-in.



All IAME drivers are required to pre order race tyres through <u>https://tillotson.ie/racing/motorsportireland/</u> T4 competitors can pre purchase their race tyres from Kiltorcan Raceway prior to the event. Tyre barcodes will be scanned at the Tillotson collection point on Saturday from 11am until 1pm for IAME classes only, and from 2pm until 4pm for T4 classes only.

These race tyres must be used for Official Practice/Timed Qualifying, Heats & Finals. Only barcoded tyres that have been purchased from the official tyre retail outlet can be used for Official Practice/Timed Qualifying, Heats & Finals.

The scrutiny section of the INEO system will close at 9am on Sunday morning and it will not be possible to make any changes to your equipment after this time. It is the responsibility of each driver / entrant to ensure this is completed on time. Only equipment registered on the INEO system and / or scanned at tyre collection can be used on race day. Use of unregistered components will result in exclusion from the session where detected.

Checks may be performed on selected karts by the Scrutineers at any time. Please note that this includes performing selected checks on karts at the entry to the pre grid as selected by the scrutineering team.

Driver Check In

Driver check in will take place in the Clubhouse on Saturday from 2.30pm until 5.30pm and it is mandatory for all drivers /entrants. Please bring the following items with you:

- Valid competition kart licence of appropriate grade.
- Valid minor entrant license for drivers under the age of 18.
- Transponder number.
- Race suit and helmet for inspection.

Any competitor who is unable to attend Saturday check in must notify the event secretary by email to countykildaremotorclub@gmail.com no later than 5pm on Saturday, 22nd March to make alternative arrangements.

Anyone who does not complete the check in process will not be permitted to race on Sunday.

Race Day

Driver's Briefing

Driver's Briefing will take place at 8:30am on Sunday morning on the start line. A roll call will be taken & failure to attend will result in a €50 fine as per App 70.1.21.3

Meeting Status

There will be a meeting status board on display at the entry point to the pre grid area. Please refer to this board throughout the event and in particular, in changeable conditions.

- If the meeting status is DRY only slick tyres can be used.
- If the meeting status is WET only WET tyres can be used.
- If the meeting status is OPEN slick or wet tyres can be used.



Pre Grid

It is the responsibility of each driver to ensure they are on the pre grid on time for each race. Access to the pre grid will commence as soon as the previous class has left the dummy grid for their race. The GATE for access to the dummy grid will close 5 minutes after the start of the previous race when the time clock placed at the entrance reaches Zero each time. Once the gate is closed you cannot leave and re enter the pre grid.







Running Order

The running order for the event will be as per the table below. Any alterations to the running order will be posted on the digital notice board <u>https://www.timing.ie/events-cat/kart-racing-2025/</u>

The plan is to break for lunch after the completion of Heat 1, however competitors should keep themselves aware of track activity to ensure that they are ready for their session / race.

County Kildare Motor Club reserve the right to merge grids within track licence limits to ensure an efficient running of the event.

Race Start Procedure

All classes EXCEPT for T4 Bambino will be Rolling Starts. The T4 Bambino will be a Standing Start.



Rolling Starts


All karts must be in a two-row formation by the time the karts cross the Red Line as outlined in the track map below. Karts cannot overtake to retake grid positions once they have crossed the red line and must remain in the position they are in when they crossed the red line.

The pace between the red and yellow lines must be a constant or reducing. Failure to do so will result in a false start and an additional formation lap. The red line and yellow line will be marked by cones on the side of the track.

The lights will go out if the starter/COC are happy with the formation and pace. Once the lead competitors have crossed the yellow line the lights will be extinguished before they reach the start line, and the race will start.

Standing Starts

Competitors will leave the pre grid area and proceed around the track at a reduced speed to the start finish line. Competitors will be met by an Official in the centre of the track with a red flag raised above their head. Grid Marshal(s) may be present to assist competitors in taking their correct grid position. Once all competitors are in the correct position, the start marshal will raise a green flag from the left-hand side of the track. This will signify the race start.





Competitors will take the chequered flag at the start finish line (marked S/F on the map above).

Competitors are required to do a full cool down lap at a much reduced speed and exit the track through the pitlane entrance marked by a blue arrow in the track map above.
