Governance:

The event will be run under the General Competition Rules of Motorsport Ireland (incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting Code of the FIA), Appendix 70.1, 70.2, 70.3, 70.4 & 70.5 of the current Motorsport Ireland Yearbook, these Supplementary Regulations and any other instructions published by Motorsport Ireland or the Organising Club relating to the event.

2 – Entries:

All entrants must hold a valid Motorsport Ireland Minor Entrants Licence or Motorsport UK PG Entrants licence.

Any competitor who is under 18-years old must have their parent/legal guardian hold a Minor Entrant licence. This is applied for by the parent/legal guardian. This person must be present at check in at all events the under-18-year-old wishes to compete in and remain for the duration of the event and publication of results. Alternatively they may nominate a third party to act as entrant as outlined below and in GCR 108.2.3.

For those wishing a third-party (anyone who is not a parent/legal guardian) to fulfil this role, then Garda Vetting is required. You will be asked to upload a paper copy of the Garda Vetting form when applying for this licence online.

If the holder of the Minor Entrant Licence is not the parent / legal guardian of the minor, then a duly completed Minor Entrant nomination form must be presented at licence check (available at: https://www.motorsportireland.com/competitors-forms

Entries will be completed using the INEO system and only Registered drivers will be permitted to enter an Event. Entries will close at 23:59 on Sunday the 04th of May in advance of the Event as per the Sporting Regulations Transponder Numbers must be complete and accurate on the entry form.

Please Note: No entries will be accepted after Sunday the 04th of May @23.59 hrs under any circumstances

The event organisers reserve the right to refuse an entry without providing a reason.

4 - Surveillance:

Audio and visual surveillance will be in operation through the event.

5 - Designated Fuel Station:

It will be each competitor's responsibility to purchase their own petrol from free practice until completion of the Event. Competitors must purchase fuel from the official designated fuel station. It will also be the responsibility of each competitor to ensure they purchase their Fuel from the correct pump or pumps at the designated station. These will be listed in the Final instructions for the Event.

It is forbidden to add any liquid and/or power-boosting chemicals to the fuel.

6 - Abuse issues:

Any incidents of abuse will be reported to the stewards who will deal with the matter.

7 - Starting of Engines:

Karts on stands in the assembly area or dummy grid area must NOT have engines running at any time. Karts may only be started on the dummy grid when the kart has all four wheels on the ground and the driver is sitting in the Kart.

No lifting of a Kart with the engine running is permitted on the dummy grid.

8 - Racing Classes:

Classes will be as follows: Rotax Micro Max Rotax Mini Max IAME Cadet Rotax Junior Max IAME X30 Junior Rotax Senior Max Rotax Senior Max 177 IAME X30 Senior

Note: Only Registered drivers will be permitted to take part in the Event.

9 - Technical Regulations:

Technical Regulations for all classes will be as defined in the 2025 Motorsport Ireland regulations published for each class on the Motorsport Ireland Website. The technical regulations will be as per technical regulations 70.2, all the necessary Homologations Fiches for the racing classes.

The penalty for breach of the technical regulations shall normally be exclusion from the session where the infringement was detected (timed practice, qualifying, heat, final), unless otherwise stated for a specific offence.

12 - Drivers Briefing:

Drivers Briefing will take place at 8:25am on the dummy grid. Attendance is compulsory for all drivers, a role call will be taken. For all Drivers under the Age of 18 it is required that their Entrant also attends Driver's briefing.

13 - Event Check In:

Will take place on the Saturday the 10th of May between 14.30hrs & 17.30hrs in the clubhouse. It will be the responsibility of each driver to ensure their sign on, scrutiny and tyre registration is completed using the INEO system in advance of all Events. Each Driver must present with their digital or physical race licence and also have their suit and helmet ready for inspection.

If anyone is unable to attend on Saturday, they MUST contact the Club via email (info@carrickonsuirmotorclub.com) and make arrangements for their check in to be completed on Sunday Morning. This will only be accommodated by arrangement with no exceptions.

14 – Tyres.

For IAME Classes, Tyre regulations for the event are as follows:

IAME Cadet:

Slicks: Maxxis T-MAX-MK-DRY1 10.0 x 4 - 5 (front) and T-MAX-MK-DRY 1 11.0 x 5 - 5 (rear) Wet: Maxxis T-MAX-MK-WET 1 10x4.20 - 5 (front) and T-MAX-MK-WET 1 11x6.00 - 5 (rear)

1 set of Slick tyres permitted for the event & MUST be scanned onto INEO system for each competitor. 1 set of New Wet tyres mandatory per event & MUST be scanned onto INEO system for each competitor. It is only permitted to have 1 set of Slick and 1 set of wet tyres registered to your profile on INEO system at each event. All race tyres MUST be purchased from Tillotson Ireland. The normal cut off for any tyre purchase is Saturday afternoon.

Note: These tyres must be separate to the tyres used in rounds of the MI National Championship.

IAME X30 Junior

Slick: Komet K3H 4.60 x 10.0 – 4 (front) and K3H 7.10 x 11.0 - 7 (rear), Wet: Komet K3W 10x4.20 - 5 (front) and K3W 11x6.00 - 5 (rear)

1 set of Slick tyres permitted for the event & MUST be scanned onto INEO system for each competitor. 1 set of New Wet tyres mandatory for the event & MUST be scanned onto INEO system for each competitor It is not compulsory to use new slick tyres at the event once they are purchased from Tillotson and on the INEO system. It is only permitted to have 1 set of Slick and 1 set of wet tyres registered to your profile on INEO system at the event. All race tyres MUST be purchased from Tillotson Ireland. The normal cut off for any tyre purchase is Saturday afternoon.

Note: For clarification: Tyre regulations are the same as per appendix 70.3 but the tyres used at a plate meeting are separate to the allocation for the championship events.

IAME X30 Senior

Slick: Komet K3H 4.60 x 10.0 – 4 (front) and K3H 7.10 x 11.0 - 7 (rear), Wet: Komet K3W 10x4.20 - 5 (front) and K3W 11x6.00 - 5 (rear)

1 set of Slick tyres permitted for the event & MUST be scanned onto INEO system for each competitor. 1 set of New Wet tyres mandatory for the event & MUST be scanned onto INEO system for each competitor It is not compulsory to use new slick tyres at the event once they are purchased from Tillotson and on the INEO system. It is only permitted to have 1 set of Slick and 1 set of wet tyres registered to your profile on INEO system at the event. All race tyres MUST be purchased from Tillotson Ireland. The normal cut off for any tyre purchase is Saturday afternoon.

15 – Flag Signals, Lights, LED Panel.

The officials of the meeting will have the ability to display messages to competitors whilst on track through the use of an LED panel mounted on or near the Start line Gantry. Messages displayed to competitors on the LED panel will have the same meaning and effect as that of flags and number boards and must be obeyed at all times. Failure to do so may result in a penalty. Below are samples only of messages which may be displayed:



Flag signals may be supplemented by or replaced by light signals and will have the same authority and jurisdiction as flag signals. Therefore, breaches of signals given by light signals will be treated in the same way as breaches of flag signals.

16 – Miscellaneous.

A neck brace is mandatory for all drivers in the T4 Bambino class.

Neck braces are strongly recommended for drivers in all classes.
